So we can all breathe a huge sigh of relief and get on with running Grafton Childcare on a day to day basis and making plans for the future and continual professional development of both the staff and setting.

## Parking Arrangements

As a final reminder our parking arrangements are:-

**Before** 9.30 am and **after** 4.00 pm ensure that at all times you park in our two designated areas on the Blue Tarmac and do not block access to other users. Please do not leave your engine running whilst dropping off your children. Not only is this illegal it is also very inconsiderate towards our neighbours. Or you can if you wish park in Mount Pleasant Road. But **please** do not park your vehicle at any time on the Double Yellow Lines outside the front of our property for any reason or in the disabled bay on the corner of Mount Pleasant Road. Once you have parked your vehicles, you can when the rear gates are open walk down our rear slope and ring the doorbell on the Conservatory door and a member of staff will

Remember when the rear gates are closed between 9.30 am - 4.00 pm then once you have parked at the rear of number 22 Torquay Road, you may only park here between 9.30 am - 4pm please walk around and collect your children from our front door. We would appreciate it if **all** parents could please cooperate fully with our parking scheme and don't let your parking skills lapse now we have gained planning permission as we do still have to get on with our neighbours. Please don't be offended if you come to the front door before 9.30 am and after 4pm and we ask you to walk around to the back door. This is for the safety of your child and all the children attending so that we can concentrate on who is leaving and arriving from one exit and not two and don't have to keep running from one door to the other with our signing in sheets!
