Have You Heard Grafton Childcare is Expanding!

Over the next few weeks we shall be having the front garden of number 22 fenced and made safe for the children to use, with a picket gate connecting the two gardens. Then at the rear of number 22 we need to have a number of the existing fence panels replaced and some new gates connecting the two gardens and handrails put in to make it safe and secure for the children, staff and parents, to make use of the outside areas.

Then we come to the inside of the property. We have popped a picture of the floor plan of next door into the middle of this newsletter, hopefully it will be able to give you all a flavour of what we have planned for there.

But briefly our existing premises will be used mostly by the under two and a half years olds and next door will be used mostly by the over two and a half year olds. But all the children will be able to move between buildings with their Key Workers dependant on what activities they are engaged in. As you can see from our floor plans we are extremely excited to be able to have a dedicated room which will be set aside purely for the children to carry out arts and crafts activities, which not only the children but also the staff are very excited about. Having a dedicated room will mean that we can provide so many more opportunities for your children to learn through meaningful spontaneous creative play linked to their current interests and themes or topics which we are covering in the setting as a whole.

But don't worry on **Saturday 29th October** we plan on having an **Open Day** here at Grafton Childcare, so parents will all be able to come around and take a good look around the whole setting and ask any questions you might have about what we have planned for the extra rooms and space we shall have available to use by the children. We shall send out official invitations nearer the time, but please pencil the date into your diaries now. We shall run an appointment system throughout the day, so you can all have a good look around and have time to look though your children's Learning Journals and ask any questions you might have about your child's Key Workers planned Next Steps with us at the same time.



Daily Diaries & the Early Years Foundation Stage

Recently we have sadly been required to turn a number of children away at the door because they have not arrived with their Daily Diaries. The Early Years Foundation Stage applies to all children from birth until they go into Year 1 of primary school. The Childcare Act 2006 puts a legal obligation on us to work in close partnership with parents of any child in this age group. You will have been supplied with a Daily Diary Booklet and small A5 Folder for your child.

Can we remind you that this **must** accompany your child each time they attend Grafton Childcare or sadly childcare will be declined and full contracted fees will still be payable. Details of food and drinks consumed, nappy changes, activities and accidents will be recorded by Grafton Childcare in your child's individual booklet on a daily basis, unless you turn up unusually early to collect your child. Parents are requested to record information about their child relating to changes in routine, current interests and developing skills, in the booklet on the "Parents Just a Quick Note" and or the "My Favourite Things Have Been" pages on an ongoing basis, so that we are able to work in partnership for the benefit of your child. If your child has not attended for more than seven days, we ask that you provide a written update about your child in the booklet on the "Parents Just a Quick Note" pages. Lastly can we please remind parents to sign the "Daily Childcare Report" page daily, likewise we will sign against the "Parents Just a Quick Note" and read the "My Favourite Things Have Been" pages when they have been completed by parents as evidence of our Working in Partnership with Parents Policy.

To avoid the upset and embarrassment for our staff declining you on the doorstep please remember to check that your child's Daily Diary is actually in your child's bag before you set off for Grafton Childcare, because it really is very awkward for your child's Key Worker to have to turn your child away at the door because you have forgot it and could be quite distressing for your child as well. Ofsted have determined that we must have each child's current Daily Diary on the premises if the child is in attendance, since this should contain the most up to date Emergency Contact and Medical information on your child, as well as a record of Existing Injuries and Accidents and any Medications recently given to your child. All of which we are legally required to hold in your child's Daily Diary. When you forget your child's Diary and ask us to accept your child, you are asking us to break our regulatory requirements as set out by Ofsted, which we can't do under any circumstances even if it will make you late for work, sorry.

Contents of Your Child's Cloth Bag

We hope you all appreciate that we have quite limited storage space at Grafton Childcare for each child's belongings, so we have provided most parents with one of our very own funky cloth bags in which we would appreciate your keeping all of your child's belongings in which you bring along to us each day.

Please could you ensure that **ONLY** the following labelled items are kept in your child's bag, Sharpie Laundry Pens from WHSmiths are ideal for labelling things and much quicker than sewing on labels:-

- 1) Your child's Daily Diary in it's very own zipped wallet with which you will be provided.
- 2) At least one complete change of clothes for your child, suitable for the current weather conditions. This might include extra layers in the Winter months, and t-shirts and shorts in the Summer. If your child is toilet training then we will need **AT LEAST** three pairs of trouser/leggings, pants/knickers and socks please.
- 3) Three disposable nappies, should your child arrive in a soiled nappy, or soil their nappy just before they leave. During the day we will use our own washable nappies and wipes on your child.
- 4) Bepanthen and/or Metanium Nappy Care Ointment, we may only use ointments supplied by yourself.
- 5) A small plastic bag in which to place any soiled or wet clothing for you to take home and wash. We never seem to have enough plastic bags here, so if you have any spare they would be very much appreciated thank you.
- 6) Suncream if you do not wish us to use Grafton Childcare's suncream.
- 7) Coat, in Summer months a lightweight pack-a-mac style and in Winter a thicker warmer waterproof style.
- 8) 2-5 sachets of Calpol/Infant Suspension with your child's name written on them kept inside the zipped wallet please, we may only give your child Calpol if it has been supplied by yourself. Please check the use by dates on your child's Calpol as we noticed that recently two children's were out of date.

We do NOT wish wet wipes, money, jewellery, valuables, small trinkets which under threes could choke on, lighters and cigarettes, any medication unless it is prescribed for your child, to be left in your child's bag, please.

Please remember that you should also supply Grafton Childcare with a Sunhat, a pair of Wellington Boots and Slippers which will be kept in our boot rack and cubbies. Remember if your child has recently had new shoes or slippers they might well also need new ones here so please remember to check the sizes of boots and slippers left here for any length of time as little feet do grow very fast at times.
